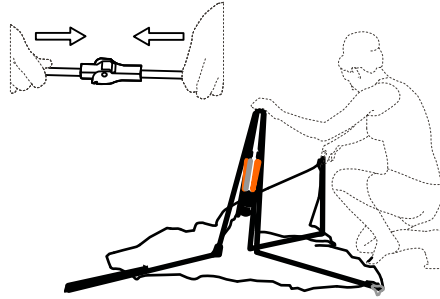
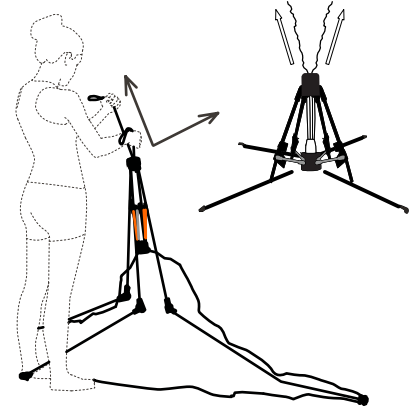


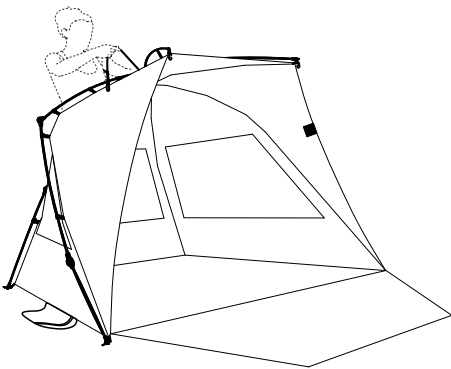
1. Remove rocks, branches and other sharp objects from the area you will lay on. Spread the shader evenly on the ground.



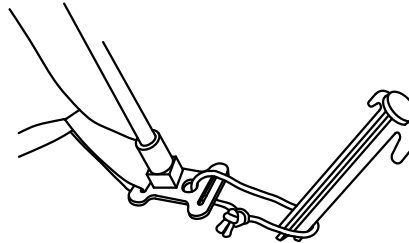
2. With central hub upright, unfold the poles and lock the joint



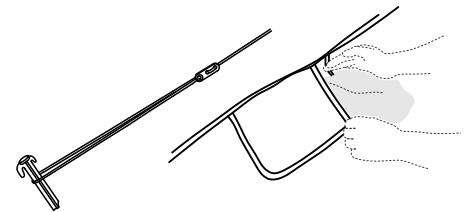
3. Standing behind the shelter grab the top orange drawstrings, one per hand, and slightly open the mechanism.



4. Pull the drawstrings firmly till upper and lower part of the hub connects and the shader takes its shape.

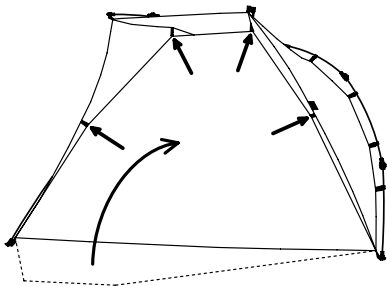


5. Secure the shader to the beach ground by inserting the included pegs in the appropriate housings at the end of each pole.

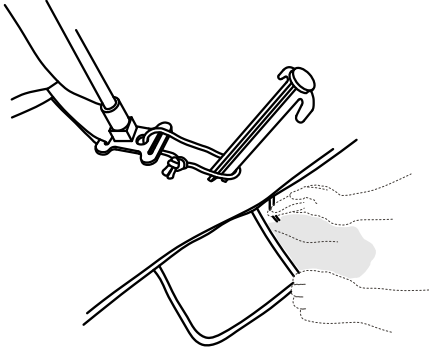


6. For extra stability secure the shader to the ground with the outer cords and fill with sand or pebbles the perimetrical outer pockets.

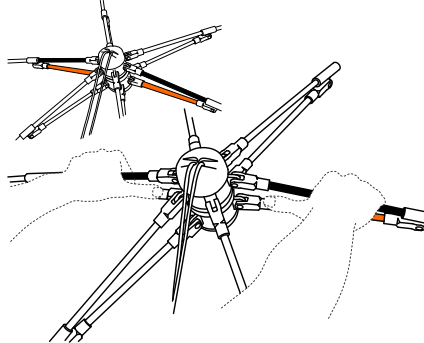

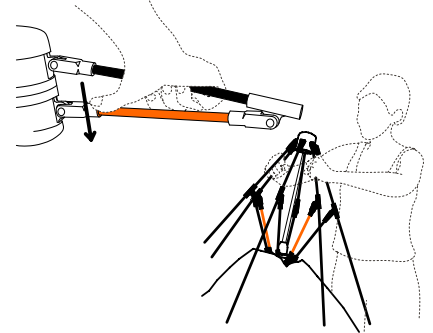
7. For extra privacy or when away from the shelter, ground sheet can be closed by hanging it to the appropriate hooks found on shelter's fabric shell.



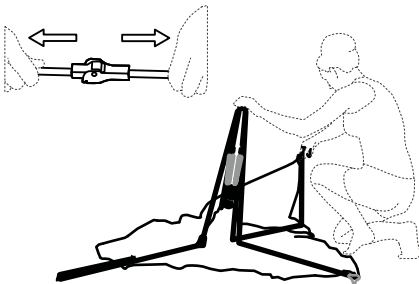
1. Remove all the pegs and empty perimetrical pockets.



2. Standing behind the shelter, grab the left and right black poles and place your thumbs on the underlying orange ones



3. Using your thumbs, push the orange poles downwards to open the mechanism and collapse the shelter.



4. Unlock the joints and fold the poles on themselves.



5. Wreathe exceeding fabric around the mechanism and place the shader in the carry bag.

Maintenance and storage instructions:

- Only water should be used when cleaning the fabrics.
- The stains should be treated locally and separately.
- The beach shader must be dry and clean before storing.
- Poles and pegs should be stored in their cases.
- Select a dry and shady place to store the beach shade.
